Thomas Folsom is a professor at Regent University School of Law. He earned his J.D. from Georgetown University and his B.S. from the Air Force Academy and worked generally in the fields of cryptology and cryptanalysis (code-making and code-breaking). Prof. Folsom clerked for Judge Robert Kunzig on the U.S. Court of Claims (one of the predecessor courts to the Court of Appeals for the Federal Circuit) and for Judge Sherman Finesilver on the U.S. District Court for the District of Colorado. He practiced corporate finance and intellectual property law in Denver, Colorado. He has taught on the faculty of the University of North Dakota School of Law, as a visiting professor at the University of Denver College of Law, as a summer visiting professor at Gonzaga Law School, and as an adjunct at the University of Colorado School of Law. He teaches in business law, contracts and intellectual property; and he writes on subjects including cyberspace, intellectual property, and normative jurisprudence.
