

## **Robert A. Heverly**

Robert A. Heverly is an Assistant Professor at Albany Law School of Union University, where he focuses his teaching and research on intellectual property, property, and information technology law. Before joining Albany Law School, Professor Heverly was a Visiting Professor at Michigan State University College of Law, and prior to that was Lecturer in Law and Director of the LL.M. Programme in Information, Technology and Intellectual Property Law at the University of East Anglia's Norwich Law School. He began his academic career as a Fellow with the Information Society Project at Yale Law School. Professor Heverly's published works include articles focused on the nature of intellectual property law, law's role in content creation and distribution, and the persistence of digital media over time and space, as well as international Internet control and governance. Professor Heverly received his J.D. from Albany Law School and his LL.M. from Yale Law School.
