Professor Nathenson teaches Intellectual Property, Cyberlaw, and Civil Procedure. He earned his law degree at the University of Pittsburgh School of Law, graduating summa cum laude and serving as Editor-in-Chief of the University of Pittsburgh Law Review. Prior to teaching, Professor Nathenson served as a law clerk to the Honorable D. Michael Fisher and the Honorable Joseph F. Weis, Jr. of the United States Court of Appeals for the Third Circuit. Professor Nathenson's writings have appeared in the Harvard Journal of Law & Technology, the University of Pittsburgh Law Review, the University of Louisville Law Review, and the Akron IP Journal. He writes about Cyberlaw, Intellectual Property, Procedural Justice, and Legal Education. His most recent scholarship focuses on procedural justice in private IP enforcement, and on innovative methods of pedagogy that use online role-playing simulations.
