Eva E. Subotnik is joining the faculty at St. John's University School of Law (fall 2011), where she will be teaching copyright and intellectual property law courses. Prior to her appointment, she was an Intellectual Property Fellow at the Kernochan Center for Law, Media and the Arts at Columbia Law School, working on copyright law and policy issues applicable to the visual arts, sound recordings, and other media. She is currently finishing work on an article, *Originality Proxies* (forthcoming, *Brooklyn Law Review*), about originality and authorship in the context of photography. She is also working on an ethnographic study of the role of copyright as an incentive among photojournalists. Before joining the Kernochan Center, Eva was an associate at Debevoise & Plimpton LLP, where she worked on IP matters, and a law clerk to the Honorable Bruce M. Selya, of the United States Court of Appeals for the First Circuit, and to the Honorable Alvin K. Hellerstein, of the Southern District of New York.
