### ***OBVIOUSNESS IN PATENT LITIGATION KSR INTERNATIONAL V. TELEFLEX***

IPLAC, in co-sponsorship with The John Marshall Law School, will present a Panel Discussion of the recent decision of the United States Supreme Court in *KSR International v. Teleflex*.
