PURPOSE

Under faculty supervision, students will work with various community-based organizations (CBOs) to provide technical assistance and direct representation on a wide variety of immigration issues. In addition, students will draft outreach materials and present at a training for the CBOs. Students will learn about US immigration law and the practice of representing immigrants and refugees before the Department of Homeland Security and the Executive Office for Immigration Review. Through their collaboration with community groups they will experience how legal services are provided to the foreign-born community.
